PFAS STATE SNAPSHOT: MONTANA PFAS REGULATION

Montana is one of several states that has started regulating per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances ("PFAS") in groundwater. This client alert reflects the status of PFAS regulations in Montana as of February 20, 2020.



GROUNDWATER

Enacted – Ambient Groundwater Quality Standard, found in the Montana Departmental Quality Circular DEQ-7. Several public water systems were sampled in Montana, largely near cities. Montana includes narrative water quality criteria descriptions and nondegredation protections. Testing private wells is recommended, but not required.
