PFAS STATE SNAPSHOT: NORTH CAROLINA PFAS REGULATION

North Carolina is one of several states that has started regulating per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances ("PFAS") in drinking water. This client alert reflects the status of PFAS regulations in North Carolina as of March 3, 2020.



WHAT IS GENX?

These man-made compounds were introduced in 2009, and were marketed as a "safer" and "high-performance" alternative to other PFAS chemicals. The term "GenX" refers to a technology and a high-performance substance, as well as a trade name for one PFAS chemical compound used in manufacturing non-stick coatings and for other purposes. EPA has conducted health risk assessments for GenX, and GenX compounds are the subject of increasing regulation.

WHY IS THIS LOCATION IMPORTANT?

The release of GenX to the Cape Fear River (near Fayetteville and Wilmington, NC) led to numerous lawsuits against DuPont and Chemours for personal injury claims. This contamination was one of the reasons why NC DHSS established this guidance level.

DRINKING WATER

The GenX value stated by the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services ("NC DHHS") is 140 ng/L. This health screening goal is protective for the most vulnerable populations (bottle-fed infants, pregnant women, lactating women, children, and other adults). Drinking Water well sampling for GenX compounds began on a targeted basis near the Cape Fear River, and has expanded to include testing in the surrounding areas.
