## LYDIA OCTON-BURKE PENS ARTICLE FOR 'HR MAGAZINE' ON EMPLOYEES' RIGHT TO WORK FROM HOME

Associate Lydia Octon-Burke authored an article published May 11 by *HR Magazine* on how the current COVID-19 pandemic has shifted expectations as to what can be achieved when working from home. While certain jobs simply cannot be accomplished outside of the workplace – particularly those in the hospitality or retail sector – some in the UK are questioning whether a legal right to work from home should be implemented.
