HARTLEY SELECTED AS JUDGE FOR ‘MOOT COURT MADNESS’

March 19-21, 2020

BCLP Partner Sarah Hartley will serve as a moot court judge alongside several other prominent sports lawyers as the nation’s top sports law students present both sides of the *NCAA v. Alston* case in the first-ever “Moot Court Madness,” hosted by NOCAP Sports. Students from the top eight sports law programs around the country at Harvard, UCLA, Arizona State, Marquette, Notre Dame, Baylor, Texas Southern and UC Berkeley will argue both sides of the case.

Hartley is a partner in BCLP’s Boulder office practicing in the firm’s Commercial Litigation and Antitrust Groups. She is the head of the firm’s Outdoor Industry Team and a member of the Sports & Entertainment Group.
