CRAIN'S NY BUSINESS NAMES KURT STEINHOUSE AS A 2024 40 UNDER 40 HONOREE

BCLP Associate Kurt Steinhouse has been recognized by Crain's New York Business annual 40 Under 40 list, which celebrates the most talented young people in New York for their successes and impact within the business community. The honorees are chosen for their commitment working to make New York City a better place based on their work in industries like real estate, news media, law, sports, healthcare, and advertising.

Kurt sat down with Crain's to discuss his work within BCLP's US planning and zoning practice, including serving on the litigation counsel team that represents Empire State Development. This team successfully defended the state at the trial court level against community opposition to its plans to construct 10 mixed-use towers around a renovated Penn Station, the busiest transit hub in the Western Hemisphere.

When discussing the impact of his work in real estate development, Kurt noted that "being real estate-focused in New York City is so exciting...because I can help provide nice amenities and improve the quality of life in this town."
