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Geoff Pipoly, a partner in BCLP's Appellate and Supreme Court Group, was published by Law.com in its [AmLaw Litigation Daily](#). In the article, Geoff chronicles his work surrounding Temporary Protected Status (TPS) for more than 350,000 Haitians over the last two years, talking through efforts from the 2024 presidential debate to July 2026.
